


Bouhan Falligant Partner One of Nation's Top One Percent

Bouhan Falligant announced that Frank "Sonny" Seiler was recently recognized as a member of the "Top One Percent" of the attorneys in the nation by the National Association of Distinguished Counsel (NADC), an organization dedicated to promoting the highest standards of legal excellence.

Attorneys awarded membership in the "Top One Percent" are considered to be "the finest leaders of the legal profession from across the nation," according to NADC.
